DAYTON HAMVENTION QSO PARTY May 16th 2020

The Dayton Hamvention for 2020 has been <u>cancelled</u>. WWROF, in cooperation with the Hamvention organizers, wanted



to create a fun way for people to celebrate the Hamvention experience over the air – the **Hamvention QSO Party.** Let's celebrate the many years we have all had at the Great Gathering we call Hamvention. We also want to remember Ron Moorefield W8ILC who never missed a Hamvention and contributed to our club (DARA) until his recent death two days after the 2020 cancellation. Let's light up the airwaves with our remembrances of Hamventions of the past! **See you on the air!** K3LR, Tim Duffy and W8CI, Michael Kalter.

Here is the deal: 12 hour event, 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. EDST on the Saturday of Hamvention May 16, 2020. Operate CW or SSB on 160, 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 meters. **The exchange is a signal report and first year you attended Hamvention. If you have never attended Hamvention you send 2020.** Send your score (number of QSOs) to <u>3830scores.com</u> within 5 days of the event. You can print a certificate on line via www.HVQP.org. More details will appear on the Hamvention QSO Party web site being

set up now. Special bonus: W8BI, the club call of the Dayton Amateur Radio Association (DARA is the host of Hamvention) will be activated by designated DARA members from their home stations. You can add 10 points for each band/mode QSO with W8BI (12 available). So you can earn 120

bonus points (like having 120 additional QSOs). Visit: https://wwrof.org/hamvention-gso-party/

STATE QSO PARTY CHALLENGE

For those of you who like working QSO Parties there is a new year long QSO Party contest called the

State QSO Party Challenge (SQPC). The idea is similar to the CQ DX Marathon. The idea and manager of the SQPC is Dave Edmonds, WN4AFP. Dave is also chairman of the South Carolina QP committee.



There is a website that can be found here: http://stateqsoparty.com/ There is also a complete overview of the SQPC, rules, scoring and a list of QPs that are approved for the SQPC. There are 47 QPs on the approved list. Each QP you operate in counts as a multiplier. The INQP is one of the 47 as are the other three QPs that occur on the Big QP Weekend. Scoring is simple. You multiply the number of QPs you operated in over the year times the number of QP contacts. For a QP to count as a multiplier, you only have to make two QSOs. If you have a busy weekend all you have to do is sneak into the shack to make two QSOs to get your multiplier. To report your score you post your score on 3830 after each QP. 3830 keeps a running total through the year. So, each participant can track how they are doing compared to the other participants. You have the standard 7 days after each QP to report your score to 3830. The website has a chronological list of the 47 QP dates.
