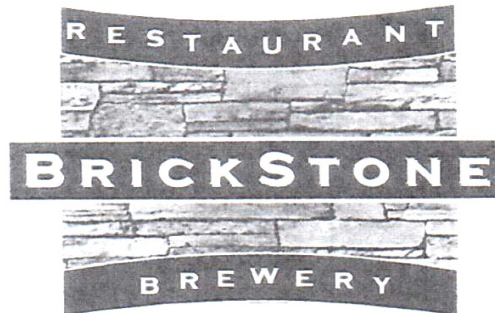

YOUTH HAPPENINGS AT W9GRS GLENN RAYMOND SCHOOL IN WATSEKA

We started the month of October off on a good note by operating during the Illinois QSO Party. Staff and students logged a station record of 392 Q's enroute to 42,000+ points on SSB, making a lot people happy to get IROQ into their logs! We even had Sophie make a few Q's. Amazing how a YL can draw some attention! In appreciation for the support by KARS members over the past 8+ years, we hope you graciously accept those points for KARS in the club competition.

The following week led to the semi-annual School Club Round-Up. We did a few things differently as focus of the event has begun to shift to pure contesting and less on exposing students and staff to the joys of amateur radio and the sciences behind it. W9GRS bucked the trend and decided to go back to the basics. We constructed a simple wire antenna for 40 meters and utilized the tried and true vertical for the other bands. That wasn't enough for us though. We talk about how little power is necessary to make communications work, and talk is cheap, so we decided to go QRP. That's right 5 watts! Students and even myself were surprised that we actually made contacts, even on SSB! I do have to go full disclosure though and admit we did have 1 contact where we "cranked it up" to 100 watts in order to make a coveted QSO with Alaskan Pilot Station School, KL7DG. We also utilized several modes including SSTV, CW, RTTY, and JT65. We did try Hell-Schreiber, but couldn't get any bites. Preliminary results have W9GRS finishing 7th in the competitive Jr. High Division, but we also don't put in a full 24 hours, nor do we run amps. Also, our focus is introduction to radio. We save the contesting for the weekends! Unofficially, we will stake claim to QRP Champion for October 2015 SCR!

We began November with a jump into the realm of CW Contesting. I was able to sneak away to school and operate a couple hours during the CW Sweepstakes. I had a couple of students meet me there and we struggled together with the cumbersome exchange that is Sweepstakes. I'm sure I botched a few serials and checks along the way!

On the radar for W9GRS is the Science Club's 40th Anniversary and we are in the development of a commemorative QSL card for it. We are also looking to complete Triple Play this year. We are couple short on the SSB/Digital Side and hopefully put a big dent in the CW column after this weekend. That is all for now and 73's from the Flatlands of Illinois!

HIGH ALTITUDE BALLOON LAUNCH

Well, it's that time of year again. The crops have been harvested and the fields in northern and central Illinois and Indiana are clear. So we can once again start launching our high altitude balloon missions.

The first mission for this season is going to be really special. It's going to involve a number of "firsts." It is being sponsored by the "Project Michelangelo Foundation" based in Bourbonnais, Illinois:

Project Michelangelo is the brainchild of creator and founder JoJo Sayson, a prominent physical therapist and incredible in Bourbonnais. His business is called "JoJo Sayson's Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation." JoJo founded Project Michelangelo to work with disabled and challenged kids. He and his group of volunteers use archery as a way of helping these kids learn that despite their handicaps, they can achieve great things by keeping their eye and energy focused on the "bullseye" in their own life. They truly can achieve their dreams — they only need the vision and will to succeed.

For this upcoming mission, we will be using the largest balloon we have used so far — a 3,000 gram balloon, that should take our payload well above 100,000 feet!

We are tentatively planning to launch the mission from the 50-yard line of the Bradley-Bourbonnais Community High School in Bradley, Illinois. The address for the school is: 700 W North St, Bradley, IL 60915.

Launch time hopefully will be around 10:00 am. A date for the launch has not been set yet. Due to the large size of the balloon, we are going to need to wait until we have near-perfect conditions on the ground — ground wind speeds of 0 to 3 miles hour. So, I will be contacting you again only 2 or 3 days prior to launch. The launch will take place on either a Saturday or Sunday, since most people work during the week, and we are going to need everyone's help on this one!

The plan is for the Project Michelangelo kids to come to the high school and see the launch in person, and then go back to JoJo's office to watch the [APRS.FI](#) web site on a large screen TV and follow the flight from beginning to end. After the Chase Team recovers the payload packages, we'll bring them back to JoJo's office to see if we can get some preliminary pictures and flight data for them to enjoy.

I have been working daily on this flight for the past 3 months, designing, building and testing various "launch vehicles" to carry Astronaut Bob into Near Space. I'm now on my third vehicle design and I think it's going to work well.

In addition, I have been testing the Field of View of the GoPro HERO 3+ Silver Edition cameras we will be using, testing special extended capacity batteries (2780 Mah) and memory cards (64GB), to make sure that we don't run out of power or recording capacity during the flight. I have purchased a new SPOT GPS Tracker (Generation 3) that will give us position updates every 2.5 minutes instead of the 10-minute updates we were getting with the older SPOT units.

We will also be testing a second (back-up) APRS transmitter for the first time on this flight. The primary unit, a Byonics All-In-One (AIO) transmits at 10-watts of power. The back-up unit, a Byonics MT-1000, will transmit at 1-watt. My plan is to have the two radios transmit at overlapping intervals — the primary unit will transmit its signal once every 3-minutes. The back-up unit will transmit about 1.5 minutes later, and so forth. So we should be receiving position and altitude updates about every minute and a half throughout the 2-hour flight.

Needless to say, we would love to have your help for this special event. We are going to need all of the capable and willing hands we can get for both the launch and the chase. If you would like to help, please contact me at:
