The KARS Board of Directors is working hard to arrange for a return to normal General Meeting in July.


We are searching out the best possible venue for our meetings and also a good program for July.

The net meets every Monday at 8 PM local time on the 146.34/.94 repeater.



LEARN YOUR LOCAL HISTORY—GO ON A FOXHUNT

May 8th our fox Jim WD9GXU "not a local" took our hunters to a place we "locals" had no prior knowledge of. We were led by way of 2 meter transmitter signal to the former residence of a highly decorated war hero of WW2, Korea and Vietnam just south of Momence, Illinois. From the Wiki page:

"Colonel James Helms Kasler (May 2, 1926 – April 24, 2014) was a senior officer in the United States Air Force and the only person to be awarded the Air Force Cross three times. The Air Force Cross ranks just below the Medal of Honor as an award for extraordinary heroism in combat.

Kasler was a combat veteran of World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War. In Korea, as an F-86 Sabre pilot with the 4th Fighter-Interceptor Wing, he was recognized as an ace, credited with shooting down 6 MiG-15s. Kasler flew a combined 198 combat missions and was a prisoner of war in North Vietnam from August 1966 until March 1973.

He flew a total of 101 combat missions in an <u>F-86E Sabre</u> and scored 6 confirmed air-to-air victories and two more damaged against <u>MiG-15s</u>, becoming among the first <u>jet aces</u> of the Korean War. [4]

He spent the last 39 years of his life as a resident of <u>Momence, Illinois</u>, where he owned and developed South Shore Golf Course in Momence and had interests in banking and real estate, served on a number of boards and received a variety of civic and service awards."

The residence is now owned by a local who wanted to honor the memory of the Colonel with the memorial pictured above. The memorial is situated on what was formerly the 4th hole of the South Shore Golf Course from the 1920's era. We thank this current resident and patriot for his desire to preserve the Colonel's memory.
