

KARSFEST UPDATE

By the time you read this, the 2022 DeKalb Hamfest at Sandwich will be history. KARS had its presence there, as about 150 flyers and a few tickets for Prize Give-Aways were sent over to the Hamfest Chairman there mid-week. I was also there for the fest, as I wanted to see this one for the first time, and I had things to get.

Next stop, Dayton. 1500 Flyers will be printed up for this one, and we're sending over 15 tickets for door prizes. I'm asking for some help in helping get flyers distributed. Anyone who's going, and who'd like to help, please get in touch with me. I will need the help mainly on Friday afternoon. I hope to be there with Len, KB9MY helping with the transportation, but we don't know how long it's going to take since we have a stop in Cincy on the way (?) to pick up another member of the team to go. I may not be staying for the Sunday afternoon prize drawing because of my travel arrangements.

While there, I will be checking out vendors to see if any will be interested in exhibiting at KARS-Fest. I will also be looking to bring back most, if not all the folks from last year's KARS-Fest. So far, we have commitments from Cable Experts, Dit & Dash, and Convention of States (they're conducting a petition-signing drive, and their cause is both fascinating and important; I'll be spending a little time there collecting signatures as well). I also have three other vendors I intend to bring back. The goal this year is all of ten indoor vendors. We'll see.

With other Hamfests folding up and going away, of which the Madison (WI) and Six Meter Club of Chicago Hamfests being the latest casualties, the expectations for KARS-Fest continues to improve. I don't prefer to gloat about that, because diminishment is not progress, but there are several other Ham-Fests which are still going well, such as South Milwaukee and Hamfesters (both also in July) but I expect great things from KARS-Fest for both this year and in years to come.

Having said that, I think that the members of KARS should start to think ahead about finding my successor as KARS-Fest Chairman (or Woman—you ladies can do it. The South Milwaukee Hamfest Chairperson is a YL who does a thoroughly marvelous job). I believe that I've been KARS-Fest Chairman for five years, not counting 2020, and there's going to come a point where I might not be able to do this anymore. This should not be the fate of such a great event as KARS-Fest, to lose it when it loses me. If you have any organizational skills at all, you should consider the task. Work is mainly seasonal, and my predecessor Craig N9FD and I are here to show you the ropes before you are fully in harness. It's something to think about. With the work goes the prestige. And it's all worth it, for you, for your standing in the Ham Radio Community in the Midwest, and for KARS especially.
