Technically not a contest, ARRL Field Day is the largest operating event in all of ham radio. It's is actually a test of local amateur radio communications readiness on a nationwide scale.

Setup will start at 10AM Saturday June 22nd. Operations commence at 1PM local and run around the clock till 1PM Sunday. Camp all night if you like or come and go as you please.
