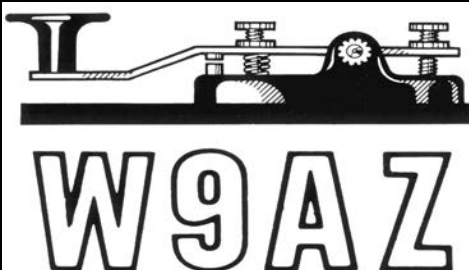

K9YA FAST NET:

Every FIRST Wednesday of the month, we operate the K9YA Fast Net. The Fast Net is called at 20+ wpm.

K9YA SLOW NET:

The slow net operates on the 2nd, 3rd and 4th Wednesday of the month at 7:00 P.M. local. Typically, the Slow Net is called at 10 to 13-wpm. Listen for CQ Slow Net and then send your callsign at YOUR speed. The net will QRS (slow down) to the speed of the slowest op.

The club participated in a Hobby Show during December 1953 which was sponsored by the Kankakee Park District.

Radioteletype was demonstrated by Beryl Dassow, W9HKA at the January 1954 meeting (wonder what kind of computer he used?).

Membership was at a high point at the February 2, 1954 meeting with 25 present.

Kankakee Radio Club joined with the Iroquois County Club in a transmitter hunt on May 21, 1954. The frequency of 3920 kilocycles was used. The club became interested in joining Civil Defense activities about this time.

At the May 4, 1954 meeting, an employee of the Illinois Bell Telephone Company demonstrated how microwave equipment works with "The Magic of Microwaves." There were 35 in attendance for this most interesting program.
