SWAIN'S ISLAND EXPEDITION UNDERWAY!

Jerry WB9Z, Carl K9CS and all the rest of the <u>Swains's Island</u> crew are on their way to the far reaches of the Pacific Ocean. Their destination is the tiny atoll called Swain's Island...a part of the Tokelau chain.

It is an unincorporated, unorganized territory of the United States administered by American Samoa. Swains Island has a population of 37 Tokelauans, who harvest the coconuts.

Swain's ranks number 31 (out of 340) in the DX Magazine most wanted list. The island is about one mile in circumference and has only five permanent residents and no infrastructure.

Operation will be on all bands 160 to 6 meters and modes CW, RTTY, SSB.

Plans are to arrive on September 5th and immediately start setup with operations scheduled to start on the 6th and end on the 18th.

ALL OPERATION WILL BE SPLIT! Listen before you call! It should be only moderately difficult for US stations but very difficult for EU stations...don't call if they are operating "EU" only.

WB9Z, K9CS, K9CT, 9V1FJ. AA4NN, DJ2VO, DL3DXX, K5AB, K9NW, N2TU, N6HC, N6HD, NA6M, ND2T, SM5AQD, W6KK, W8GEX, W8HC, W8TN

Valerie NV9L will be the North American pilot station.

Following the Swain's operation, Craig K9CT and others will venture to Conway Reef (3D2C) and operate from September 24th to October 5th. Check out:
