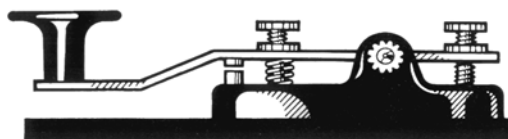

### W9GRS IN THE SCHOOL CLUB ROUNDUP by Troy W9KVR

Here are the raw numbers for the February School Club Round Up. Eighteen different people made at least one QSO, enroute to a station record of **213** QSO's. We tied our own record of "the 3rd most schools contacted" with **34**, and had our 3rd most total points with **70,805**. Seventh grader, Quentin, KD9LBO made **86** of our QSO's to help lead the way. We also operated as Net Control for the ICARC 2-Meter Monday Night Net as well. I don't know how it will shake out placing-wise, but we should be in the mix for another top 3 finish for this year.

### W9IEY "DREAM" STATION

This is a picture of my "Dream" station. I grew up in South Chicago and as a teenager I discovered the short wave bands on my parent's floor model parlor radio. One ham station on 80 meters had an outstanding signal and was quite a rag chewer. He was Arnold, W8VBW (Very Best Wishes) from Benton Harbor Michigan. He had a **BC-610**. It was clear and loud just like a Broadcast Station. I decided then that I wanted one just like that and eventually wanted to talk to him.

I found an "Elmer" W9FGP and he helped me get my novice license in 1954, but I had to master the code at 15 wpm or no test. He didn't want a "LID" on the air. My first rig was a 6L6 PI-NET Homebrew with a **Hallicrafters S-38C** receiver. First QSO was on 07/15/54.

Doing odd jobs I saved up some money to buy a decent rig. It was probably going to be a Viking II. On a trip to Allied Radio at 100 N. Western, I saw an add posted for a **BC-610-E**. WOW!!!!

I talked my dad into going to see the xmtr. I didn't even know what it looked like. W9EUY had it in his garage. It was in like new condition and had never been on the air. The story was that it had been custom assembled for someone at Hallicrafters and came with a commercial speech amp. No cables or control circuits were included. He bought it at an auction. He was reluctant to sell it to a kid but a deal was made for \$250. With great difficulty dad and I got it home. Just then I caught the measles and spent some time in bed during which I was designing the control circuits. The rig (with a **Hallicrafters SX-28A**) was put on the air 10/05/55 and it is still going strong.

P.S. I did talk to Arnold with my new RIG. Station equipment today: **BC-610-E SN 386**, **BC-614** with an RME speech clipper (audio), **Collins R-390**, Hi Gain Hytower...0.5 to 30mc. 500 Watts out.
