

# KARS HAPPENINGS April 18 1942

Thanks to Bill W9VQG SK

Ed Drolet W9IBU was President of KARS from 1942 to 1944.
Raising money was of prime importance. Local hams were interested in 2 1/2 Meters and plans were being made to get back on the air after the war. Meetings were held twice a month.

\*A letter was received from the U.S. Naval Air Station in Norfolk, Virginia asking for 100 experienced radio mechanics at \$1.06/hr, assistants at \$0.59/hr. Club affiliation with the ARRL was discussed at the April 22, 1942 meeting. Local hams were active in Civilian Defense and Red Cross work during World War II. Radio operators were in great demand with top pay of \$3200 per year for 40WPM operators!

Local hams were used in black out tests when other communications proved inadequate.
