

YOUTH IN AMATEUR RADIO

Even though W9GRS does not have their permanent station set up yet at the new QTH, that doesn't mean we are QRT. The school station did manage to check one more box off with the confirmation of Alaska on 80 meters as they have now joined the 5-Band Worked All States Club! It was an unexpected goal as towards the end of last school year, we noticed that we were within striking distance of making it happen. With the advent of FT8 during Field Day operations and a couple before school operations, the slots finally filled in. Definitely not something we expected to happen when we made our first QSO back in 2008! The certificate will be a nice addition to the DXCC, Triple Play, and SCR awards!

Troy W9KVR and Chris W9CJM took the call on the road and activated the Iroquois County Wildlife Preserve (POTA K-4132) during the 2021 ILQP. The team utilized Kenwood TS-480SAT into a BuddiPole antenna system, utilizing Chris' new truck's inverter power system. We later believe it led to some of the RF interference reports we were getting with some of our QSO's. We were able to put 25 QSO's into the log and help the KARS cause in the ILQP as we traditionally do each year we operate using the school call.

A few days later, we were back at it as we took the radio and BuddiPole to Indiana during our annual 8th grade geology field trip to Turkey Run S.P. Learning from the ILQP experience, we brought along a 12-volt battery to power the radio. After spending the day checking out the geology of Shades and Turkey Run S.P., we activated Turkey Run (POTA K-2272). Not only did we activate the park, but it was also during the October School Club Round-up. It was the second time we have done this as we did this in 2016. 5 different students braved the mic along with W9KVR and in just under an hour's time, put 16 stations into the log, including several schools and a handful of Park-to-Park's! It was a great demonstration of the versatility of radio operations and definitely look forward to future portable operations!

BuddiPole Sidebar: Over the past couple years, I have caught the POTA bug and longed to activate a park some day. I had experience operating portable using a single-band hamstick or Tarheel antenna, but found it a bit challenging to operate on multiple bands. After a bit of negotiating, I convinced the lovely Mrs. Simpson in letting me purchase a BuddiPole antenna system last winter. I had done some reading up on them and made the plunge getting the deluxe antenna system, which includes tripod, extra whips, and carry bag. I actually set it up and tested it in my father-in-law's (KC9HHT) kitchen the day I got it. We happened upon seeing Jerry WB9Z on FT8 in Florida and worked him w/20 watts from the indoor antenna! Since that time, I have used the BuddiPole for not only portable operations for Field Day, POTA, school operations, but as a WARC band antenna alternative. The antenna has proven it's worth as I confirmed WAS / WAC on 30m and within spitting distance of DXCC on that band. Combining the QSO's made on 12m and 17m, I have been able to achieve DXCC utilizing only the BuddiPole. I usually have it set up as a horizontal dipole, but have experimented as a sloper and vertical. Overall, I have been pleased with the performance, though I have bent and broke a couple of the extendable whips due to my set up mistakes.
