The Best of Both Worlds: Caving and Radio

I had the unique opportunity to combine two of the things I enjoy doing most when [Illinois Caverns State Natural Area](#) (POTA K-4131) opened back up after being closed for better than 12 years. (trying to make our favorite KARS KEYS editor, K9NR jealous, hi hi). I have always wanted to operate from cave site using my very appropriate callsign W9KVR, thinking it would be a unique situation. In fact that was one of the main reasons why I chose to purchase a BuddiPole nearly two years ago. The site is home to perhaps the most unique place people can visit on state land, with Illinois' third longest cave being on the property, topping out at over 5 miles of total subterranean passages. I have been there several times before and looked forward to returning, but this time I would be a volunteer helping visitors access the cave and even join a few groups as they explore Illinois' subterranean wonder. The state has had difficulty keeping the park open due to lack of staff and they called on the caving community to help staff on weekends, so people can visit the park. I jumped at the chance and would get my chance on the weekend of July 23-24. Knowing that I would be on the property, I also planned on bring radio gear and perhaps be able to squeak in a few QSO's from the park as part of a Parks on the Air operation.

Being a volunteer has its perks, as I would be allowed access to the cave after park hours and also be able to stay overnight on the site. This would be crucial in my POTA operations and give me an opportunity not afforded to previous radio activations. The park opens at 8:30am, last visitors are allowed into the cave at 2:00pm, all have to be out of the cave at 3:00pm, and off park grounds by 4:00pm. In addition, the park is only open on Saturday and Sundays, and that is IF there are volunteers to staff that weekend. In terms of radio operations, this really limits time on air from the park and some of the previous 5 activations were actually from the gate entrance. I arrived that Saturday morning, along with two other caving club buddies to begin our weekend shift and we put together a game plan of who was doing what and when. After a rush of visitors during the first couple hours, we had some down time and I set up my station about 150 yards from the cave entrance near the park office. My station consisted of BuddiPole set up as a horizontal dipole, Kenwood TS-480, HP laptop, and fortunate enough to access commercial power via an extension cord. As I was having lunch, I tuned up on 20 meters and began "CQing" Parks on the Air from K-4131. I managed to pull in 9 QSO's in a half hour, including HA9RE, who was very excited to make a contact from Monroe County. After a bit of time doing caving responsibilities, I was able to fire up the radio and put a handful of QSO's in the log both on 20 and 40m, thus making it a successful activation. I ended up heading back in with my caving partners and spent another 4 hours reacquainting myself with Illinois Caverns and getting photos and videos I can use in my classroom. After getting a fill of caving and having our traditional dinner at a Mexican restaurant in Waterloo, I fired up the radio for a first ever "Late Shift" operation from Illinois Caverns, something that has never been done, because the general public cannot stay on the property. A personal goal of mine was to surpass the previous activations total of 45 QSO's and I knew that was a definite possibility with the rare "Late Shift" ahead of me. I called "CQ POTA W9KVR from Illinois Caverns K-4131" and the fun began! I enjoyed being on the other end of a pile-up and started to rack up the contacts. The highlight for me was hearing the very familiar call of "WB9Z" and being able to chat with Jerry for a short bit and find out that my radio set-up was doing a pretty good job. Around 10:00pm the QSO's became fewer and figured it was time to pull the plug and get some rest. The next morning, brought warm temperatures and high humidity, definitely will be spending more time in the cave than on the surface. I fired up the radio over breakfast before the park opened and logged a few more phone contacts, then decided to switch over and try some FT8. I wasn't sure how it would play out with the laptop, but it appeared to work well as I was able to put the first ever digital contacts from Illinois Caverns into the log. By the time it was all said and done, 111 stations had K-4131 in their logs, including 16 of which were Park to Park contacts. When I got home I uploaded the log to the POTA website and discovered each day I operated, actually were considered separate operations, so not only is W9KVR on the top of the K-4131 QSO list, but also the top on activations of the park. I will be putting together a QSL card commemorating this historic activation and look forward to sending those out. Interestingly, I also have the unique scenario where I have activated two parks now that are listed sequentially. (Illinois Caverns K-4131 and Iroquois County State Wildlife Area K-4132).

I have plans to travel and activate other parks in the near future and of course perhaps another double-duty at Illinois Caverns.
