



WISIA 7 FROM THE KARS ARCHIVES - Pages from 1942

This is a first of many pieces of KARS history to be published in the Key Klicks newsletter

1942 Civil Defense was in the planning stages headed by Kankakee State's Attorney Ed Drolet W9IBU (later W9IM) in this Kankakee Dailey Journal clip below.

At right the minutes from a special meeting of KARS from June 10th 1942. Pages 4 and 5 show the OSL card images in our possession of many of those in attendance.

Plan Civilian 1942 Defense Radio Unit Here

Plans for equipping and staffing of a city and county civilian de-fense short wave radio network, operating under the newly issued government rules, were announced today.

Coordinator Gene Anderson of the Kankakee civilian defense council and Edward P. Drolet, county emergency coordinator of the American Radio Relay league and president of the county Amateur Radio club, said that Kankakee may be the first Illinois community equipped with radio for civilian defense,

A recruiting meeting will be held at 7:30 o'clock Wednesday evening at the city hall. Thirty or more persons are needed to round out the radio staff. No previous knowl-edge of radio is required. Although the local amateurs have made a pool of their own equipment, it is desired that those registering for this work should be prepared to buy apparatus costing not more than \$15.

Instruction sufficient to qualify them as operators in the war emergency radio service will be given in four evenings of instruction. Further training in first aid will also be given to qualify operators for membership in the civilian defense corps. Optional training in radio will be continued through the war for those interested in obtaining amateur radio operators' licenses.

The plan contemplates installation of a central station, with twoday connections to each zone and two-way connections between each zone and several walkie-talkie or auto-installed radios in each zone. Code, or dot-and-dash will not be used, since operation in this class of service is with microphones only.

All persons interested who are not now allocated to specific civilian defense duties are invited to attend Wednesday evening's meeting.

Poplar Avenue, Kankakee, Illinois on Wednesday, June 10, 1942, for the purpose of discussing a bulletin released by the American Radio Relay League, relative to the amateur plan in civilian defense.

Fred Reis being on his vacation, the meeting adjourned to the home of Edw. P. Drolet where a general discussion took place by club members relative to the following announcement made by the American Radio Relay League.

Report on the present amateur status regarding Amateur Emergency Communication registrations, available personnel, equipment, etc., was made by President Drolet to the American Radio Relay League.

The following announcement was made by President Drolet and was ordered to be presented to Mr. Newell Corson, Manager. Illinois Bell Telephone Company for their record:

COMMUNICATIONS: None.


DISBURSEMENTS: None.




QSL's of those in attendance of the June 10th 1942 special meeting



Dr J.R. Wilkinson You may also realize Dr Wilkinson's callsign is from the spark-gap era. His callsign changed later to W9AZ when country prefixes came to be worldwide. In the 1960's the club recognized from these archives that Dr Wilkinson had been a member in the 1940's and much earlier. They also recognized W9AZ to be a desirable and short callsign for the club so it was adopted and continues to be our coveted callsign today. Dr Wilkinson was present at the June 10, 1942 meeting.
