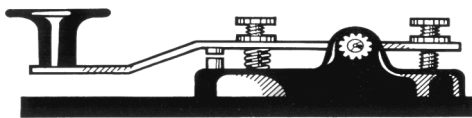

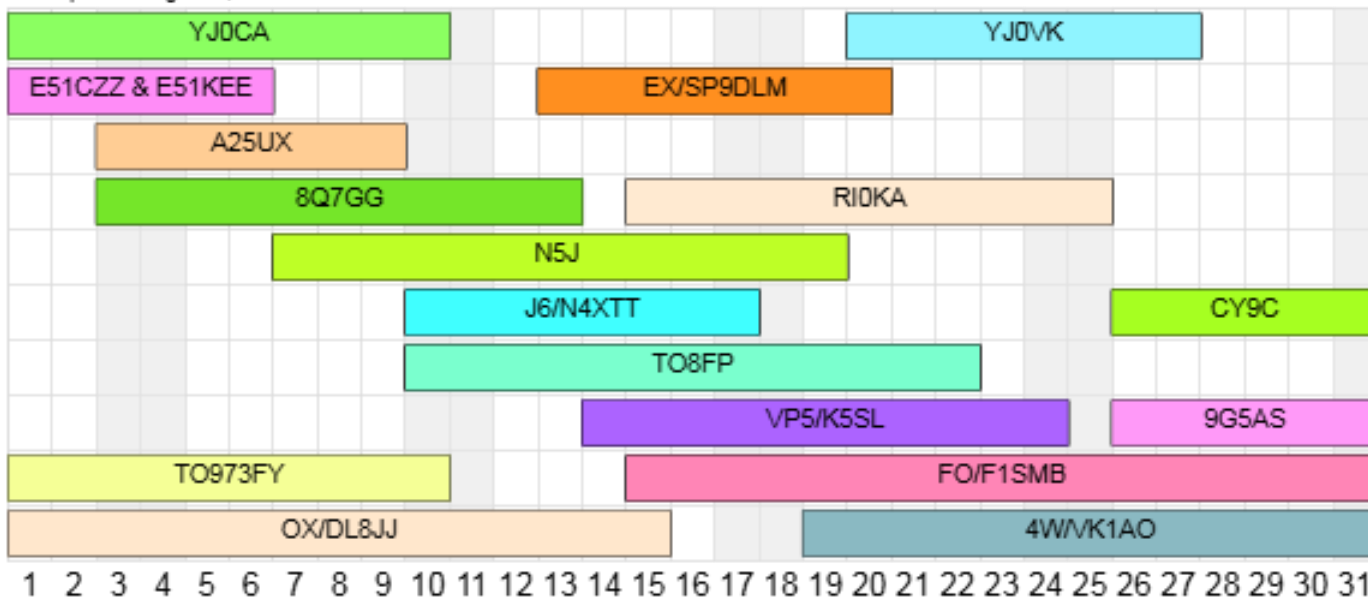

FEATURED DXPEDITIONS TIMELINE

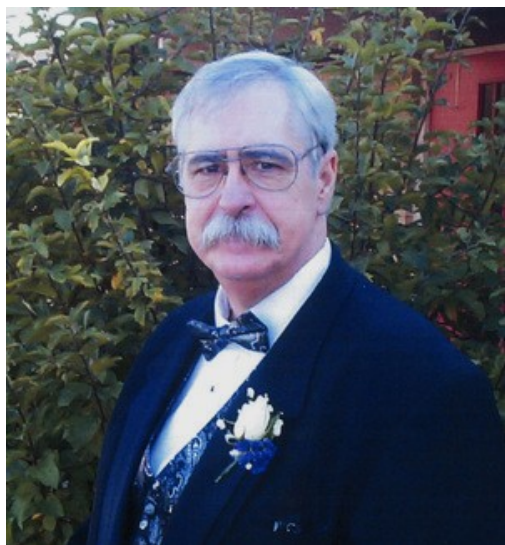

Edward J. Mossman, age 74, of St. Anne, passed away suddenly July 25, 2024, at his home. He was born June 2, 1950, in Kankakee, the youngest son of Virgil and June (Changnon) Mossman, of St. Anne. He married his soulmate, Bonnie Voss, on Dec. 31, 1972. After high school graduation, Edward enlisted in the U.S. Air Force (1968 to 1972) and was stationed at Luke Air Force Base in Arizona. He served a tour of duty in Vietnam, earning several medals and commendations. Shortly after they were married, Edward and Bonnie moved to Glendale, Ariz., where they lived for 10 years and began their family. When they returned to Illinois, he went back to school and earned his bachelor's degree in teaching from Illinois State University in 1990. After that, he was hired at Cissna Park Elementary School and taught junior high science and was the computer technology coordinator for more than 15 years. He loved teaching, whether it was his students or his children and grandchildren. Following his retirement, Edward spent much of his time working on the farm and teaching weather spotting classes in Joliet and Romeoville. He earned his amateur radio license in 2014 (W9EJM) and enjoyed his time talking to friends, old and new.

Ed was past KARS EC and member. We regret to inform of Ed's passing. Ed was a pleasant man who loved ham radio as well as it's association to emergency communications.

Donald L. Kerouac K9NR (SK)



We have lost a good man and friend, Don Kerouac, K9NR. Don was a delight to be around. He was not only a good ham radio operator with strong contesting and DXing interests, but a photographer and caver among many other interests including aviation, astronomy since the age of 12 and astrophotography. Don attended star parties for decades with his old friend Will Bowser, K9FO (sk).

A man of humble beginnings Don took flying lessons at the age of 19 but regretted he soon ran out of money before getting licensed.

A long time caver he made key contributions in exploration and conservation of caves and their environments. Don was a past member of the Cave Research Foundation, giving him the opportunity to explore and survey sections of Mammoth Cave in Kentucky, and participate in Mammoth Cave Restoration Camps. He was a longtime member of the Near Normal Grotto chapter of the National Speleological Society (NSS),

and held officer positions within the group. His experience led him to be a key part of the Karst Conservancy of Illinois, including serving as president. He was part of the early explorations, surveying and conservation efforts of Pautler and Twin Culverts Caves in Southern Illinois, along with helping efforts to protect other endangered karst areas. He was a recognized figure at caving events such as Old-Timers' Reunions, NSS National Conventions and Missouri Valley Ozark Regional Conventions.

1978-2015 - A successful career as a Radio Broadcast Engineer...full turn key services from studios to transmitter plants including AM directional arrays & fine tuning of FM antennas with over 70 stations in the Illinois, Indiana, Missouri & Michigan area. His professional career shaped him as an expert radio station builder and customer service talent for the broadcast industry. His technical knowledge in broadcast engineering, antennas, and station design was unparalleled. He was always willing to help with ideas on station improvement with local hams as well. Prior to his retirement from his business Midwest Broadcasting and ISP Services Don was Chief Engineer of WKAN Radio for 25 years.

In the early days Don taught electronics classes at the local Junior College and worked for the local Motorola MSS. Don's interest in radio started at age 12 with BCB (Broadcast Band AM DXing) with his pocket transistor radio.

Along with his affiliation with CWops, the Metro DX Club and the SMC (Society of Midwest Contesters) Don operated as a team member of the WB9Z and K9CT superstations. He also operated from North Caicos achieving 2nd place world in the ARRL 160 with WB9Z and AK9F then from Montserrat ARRL 160 and CQWW CW with K9FO, K9CS and WR9L.

Don was the "go to" guy in his beloved KARS (Kankakee Area Radio Society) that he joined immediately after receiving his ham radio license in 1968 having held every office concurrently for many years currently as VP and served as the newsletter editor as well. Don's friend Ken Buser, W9IE gave him the novice test in 1968. Don enjoyed transmitter hunting with the club along with his wife Billie, K9QT who is a DXer and contesteer in her own right.

Don, a ham radio Volunteer Examiner since 1984 and AD (Assistant to the director) of the ARRL (American Radio Relay League.) A Lifetime member of the ARRL starting as an unlicensed honorary member in 1965.

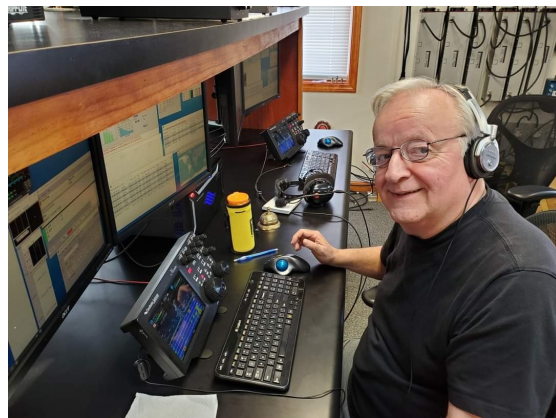
Don most importantly wanted his ham radio accomplishments/Stats of the past 56 years known to his ham friends as follows:
