



A special viewing of the Perseid Meteor Showers I will treasure forever by Greg Hart WR9L

On August 3rd of this year my very good friend of 55 years became a SK.

Of the many HAM related traditions and experiences Don K9NR and I have shared together, I will cherish them all with fond memories

His expertise and knowledge in many aspects of our mutual interests has taught me a great deal.

One of our shared interest was in astronomy, particularly in meteor showers.

The tradition of meteor watching started with Will K9FO (SK), when many of the local hams would meet him at a spot called Mary's Berries to view the stars and share many stories.

Over the years Don and I would continue this tradition, getting together many times throughout the year to spend hours looking up to the stars and Don could point out every star that had a name in the sky!

Don and I always looked forward to the Granddaddy of meteor showers, the Perseids, in early August. Craig N9FD joining us in recent years.

Don was texting me in June firming up our plans. We had a new viewing site that we used for the first time last year. It turned out to be the best location that we had ever used in the area and we were really looking forward to another great meteor shower.


Don's service was on August 11, the meteor shower was to peak that night.

The meteor shower was somewhat less productive than last year.


We still saw quite a few meteors and Don would have been upbeat about that, and then we realized he must have given us something special for this night.

Craig and I turned our heads to the North and saw the most intense Aurora that we have ever seen, stretching from the Western horizon through the North to the Eastern horizon. The Aurora persisted for at least 45 minutes dancing and shimmering with the occasional meteor dropping through the northern lights.

Don would have been talking about this one for many years but I think he probably had something to do with it including a better view. (*Photos continue on page 4*)




